Our new neighbors have persevered through incredible challenges to get here—and while many are no longer in immediate danger, they are still navigating life in their new communities and the challenges of their parole or asylum status. Many have not been or will not be able to reunite with their families. The challenges of their journey are not over yet.

By participating in Seasons of Hope, you are extending a touch of hope and humanity to our neighbors who find themselves in these circumstances. During a time of uncertainty and often painful waiting, your generosity and kindness bring hope and love, if even for a moment.

Within our Season of Hope program we will be including activities such as sending Holiday Cards, or participating in our Refugee Angel Tree. We are also launching our Emmaus Congregational Resource Center. This will be a dedicated and growing area on our website that will be filled with resources that the Body of Christ can use to educate and engage their congregations in welcoming the stranger, our refugees.

HOW TO USE THIS TOOLKIT

**USE THE FOLLOWING STEPS TO WRITE HOLIDAY CARDS
OR TO GET INVOLVED IN THE REFUGEE ANGEL TREE**

Step 1:

**Write messages of hope and encouragement in English and/or Spanish on holiday cards
Draw a picture or share your favorite poem, quote, to personalize the card. Sign the card (first name and city/state).**

**DO NOT put cards in individual envelopes.
Please place all cards in one large manila envelope or box.**

Step 2:

Mail the cards to the address provided. Our staff and volunteers will make sure that your cards are received by our asylum-seeking neighbors and friends. To choose someone from our Refugee Angel Tree, please reach out to our office at 812.490.3184.

EMMAUS Congregational Resources Center – which includes Bible studies, tool kits and spiritual reflections on immigration topics – and GIG's collection of Christian-professing prayers for immigrants, asylum seekers, and refugees.

We hope these resources can be encouraging and guiding as we work to share hope alongside one another this year.



Saba's STORY

In my homeland, I was a farmer. I owned land with a small home. My land was fertile and I had a great harvest of food to provide for my family and to feed my friends and community.

Then, the war began.

Rockets were fired upon our village and one destroyed everything we owned and worked so hard to build.

I was so afraid for my wife and my children. So we fled. We spent many months in a refugee camp. We prayed and prayed that God would deliver us.

Then, one day we got news we would be coming to America. God Is Good has helped us in so many ways. They have taught us to read and write. They have given us our home. They take care of us. Soon, we will be working and hope to give back to our community.





In the United States, which has historically helped to build and foster the international laws that protect refugees and asylum seekers, federal approvals mean that an individual can remain in the United States instead of being removed (deported) to a country where he or she fears persecution or harm.

In some cases this admittance may be a short time, such as Ukrainians fleeing the war, or in the case of federal refugee status it is permanent admittance with a clear pathway to citizenship. In order to be granted asylum, one must be seeking safety due to the threat of persecution based on:

1. Race
2. Religion
3. Nationality
4. Political opinion (or an opinion someone else from where you're coming from thinks you might have)
5. Or Membership of a particular social group.

90 Days to Self-Sufficiency

Federal refugees are vetted by the Dept of Homeland Security, FBI, and CIA. They receive five health screenings, three before they ever reach American soil, one within their first 30 days, and one after being here for one year.

Refugees are given just \$1,150 to begin their new life. From that money, GIG must lease their apartment, furnish it, ensure the refugees have adequate clothing, food supplies, and that their basic needs are supplied and their utilities are paid.

There has never been a refugee family placed in Evansville that has reached the end of their 90 day reception and placement period who has not needed GIG to step in financially to assist them.

The Federal Government expects all refugees to achieve self-sufficiency by the end of this period. In order to help our new neighbors achieve these goals, refugees are required to attend classes at God Is Good.

As we wrap up our teach section for this year we will review the statistics.

Since January 2023 GIG has served:

47 full status refugees

16 Ukrainian Humanitarian Parolees

97% have been Christ followers and are attending local churches

100% of all refugees have been employed within 100 days of arrival

4 have had no education and GIG has helped them learn to read and write
